Leadership Scenarios

CSA currently houses a library of 75 evidence-based simulation scenarios under numerous topic headings. In 2013, a USF Executive Leader DNP student, Dr. Christine Delucas, identified a gap in the library categories, indicating that out of the then current 65 scenarios, there were no leadership development scenarios. Through her work on her DNP project, she created a template that lends itself to these scenarios. They are still in use today, with 6 scenarios in this category and three more in the development phase. The current topics under leadership development are: communication, integrity, lateral violence and listening, problem solving and teamwork.

As part of my DNP project, I will be creating new scenarios that are behavior-based, utilizing the executive leadership competencies from AONE with a specific focus of leadership development for succession planning through the methodology of simulation. Behaviors will be selected based on input from nurse leaders aligning with the needs of executive leaders as they plan for the future of their organizations. It is no longer good enough to be promoted without some specific criteria for success in our rapidly changing 21st century healthcare environment. Participants will be able to increase skills, knowledge, confidence and competency as a result. The first scenario to be added to the CSA library will provide learning on gravitas behavior. Gravitas is defined as executive presence: "You will know it when you see it" is the description used most often to describe this behavior. This scenario should be available for your use by January , 2017. Beth Eichenberger, USF Executive Leader DNP student.

Mentor Program

The CSA is offering a structured support program to healthcare faculty who are engaged in simulation education. This program is designed to extend the learning experience for faculty by pairing individual learners with experienced CSA instructors. This approach is supported by recent evidence from the National Council on State Board of Nursing (NCSBN) study results and the National League of Nursing (NLN) Simulation Innovation Resource Center (SIRC) Faculty Development Toolkit. This program works to facilitate the growth of simulation faculty from Novice to Competent instructors in alignment with the Benner theoretical model utilized by the CSA.

Simulation faculty will be paired with CSA faculty who are at the competent or

higher level of experience and are Certified Healthcare Simulation Educator (CHSE) or advanced CHSE. Through a consultative approach a customized mentoring program will be designed.

CSA Apprentice Program

Heatlh*Impact* and CSA are a licensed provider of the Apprentice Simulation Curriculum (ASC) developed by SimHealth Consultants. The program is conducted by designated simulation centers around the state that have completed training as apprentice sites.

There are currently four apprentice sites in California, two in the Bay Area and two in southern California:

- Samuel Merritt University Health Sciences Simulation Center in Oakland
- The Center for Advanced Pediatric and Perinatal Education (CAPE) at Lucile Packard Children's Hospital (LPCH) at Stanford in Palo Alto
- Providence Little Company of Mary Medical Center in Torrance
- The Loma Linda University Medical Simulation Center in Loma Linda
