International Meeting on Simulation in Healthcare (IMSH) 2020

Our own CSA Director, KT Waxman will preside over the IMSH meeting and will become past-president following the meeting when Bob Armstrong assumes the Presidency.

Welcome Dr. Deb Bennett, Manager CSA

The CSA is happy to announce that Dr. Deb Bennett will assume the role of Manager (part-time). Deb will be responsible for most of the day-to-day operations of the CSA working closely with KT Waxman and the office staff. She will continue to be faculty as well. We are thrilled to have her on board! Here's a little about Deb:

Deb has been a nurse educator for over twenty years and a nurse clinician for over thirty years. She is a generalist with specialties in pediatrics and primary care. As a nurse educator, she has taught in associate, baccalaureate, and master's degree nursing programs. Deborah was the Simulation Director for California State University San Marcos for thirteen years. During that time, she developed CSUSM's simulation program and facilitated simulation for all levels of nursing students. Deborah assisted Speech-Language Pathology faculty at CSUSM in the development of their simulation program utilizing standardized patients. Also, while at CSUSM she collaborated with other healthcare disciplines to develop and facilitate interprofessional education simulations.

Deborah obtained a PhD from Washington State University in August 2015. The area of research was instrument development for pediatric medication administration competencies through simulation which was found to be reliable and valid. She is a member of SSH, SPN, INACSL, and a reviewer for the journal Clinical Simulation in Nursing. She was instrumental in launching the San Diego Simulation Collaborative and has been CSA faculty for many years.



Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) Update

The CSA has been very involved in working with the BRN to increase awareness of the evidence to support moving from 25% simulation to up to 50% for pre-licensure clinical hours. At this point, we are hopeful that guidelines for simulation will be recommended for schools next Fall. The CSA continues to move the simulation agenda forward.

Regional Collaborative Updates

Bay Area Simulation Collaborative (BASC):

VA Palo Alto Health Care System cut the ribbon on November 22, to its State-ofthe-Art Simulation Center at its main division in Palo Alto, Calif. The medical center's Simulation Program has pioneered the use of mannequin-based, fully interactive simulators in anesthesiology, intensive care, emergency medicine, and other clinical settings since the 1980s. Additionally, Veterans participate as actors to portray patients and/or family members during training sessions dealing with verbal communication.

The origin of simulation at VA Palo Alto goes back more than 3 decades when Dr. David Gaba developed the first prototype of a mannequin simulator designed to test human performance in a realistic operating room environment. The early CASE (Comprehensive Anesthesia Simulation Environment) model was connected to a Macintosh Plus computer and had vital signs on display that the operator could manipulate.

In the 1990s, the VA Palo Alto simulation center found its permanent home in building 100. Drs. Gaba, Howard, and Fish published their landmark book Crisis Management in Anesthesiology which stood as the authoritative text on this subject for 2 decades until they released the 2nd edition which is now the authoritative text. Crisis Resource Management (CRM) is used as a foundational framework for most of the simulations delivered at the VA Palo Alto. Simulation in healthcare has grown far beyond anesthesiology, and health professional schools of all disciplines worldwide have embraced simulation as a routine part of their curricula and even as a replacement for clinical time. The pioneer anesthesiologists at VA Palo Alto with the support of the Stanford Dept of Anesthesia have been integral to this global expansion and spread across healthcare disciplines.

Dr. Gaba likes to say "Simulation is a technique, not a technology." We also believe that simulation is a culture. Simulation normalizes mistakes as part of the learning process. It encourages practice, and it fosters empathy through a collective experience.

The center is one of the largest in the entire network of VA Medical Centers and looks forward to establishing further use of simulation within its local walls and also collaborating with outside agencies. Learn more on the <u>Simulation Center Webpage</u>.
